1. GAJE events and news

STILL TIME TO JOIN YOUR COLLEAGUES AT THE 5th GAJE WORLDWIDE CONFERENCE! Event: 5th GAJE Worldwide Conference, "Justice Education in a Community Context".

Place: Law School of Ateneo de Manila University, City of Makati (metropolitan Manila), the Philippines.

Date: December 7-13, 2008.

Theme: The program will be an opportunity for law teachers, law students, legal practitioners, jurists and social activists to acquire new ideas, models, and skills for the use of education to promote justice and to address implementation of new GAJE Justice Education Initiative. Most sessions will be interactive and will involve presenters from more than one country. GAJE received a record number of conference proposals and more than 90 sessions are now scheduled. For most of the conference there will be four simultaneous programs taking place. Over 150 delegates are now confirmed and total attendance may set a record for GAJE conferences. This GAJE conference provides an important new feature that gives each presenter a personalized log-in password to the GAJE web site where the presenter can create her own biography page and put her presentation materials on the web site. On-line registration remains open and on-site registration is permitted.

to connect the skills of aspiring lawyers and law related persons from around the world with a project that will give them insight into social justice and public interest law internationally and specifically in Southeast Asia. The internship aims to produce a tangible work product that will be utilized in the communities in which BABSEA works, and will directly result in disadvantaged populations gaining greater awareness of and access to their legal systems, as well as helping to provide support to our partner universities and organizations. The legal interns gain a greater understanding of the law as it is applied and practiced in developing legal systems, while having an incredible cultural immersion and exchange in the beautiful sub-tropics of Southeast Asia.
